Re: San Francisco's Proposed Opt-In Ordinance

This is a call to arms!

I am asking you, as a key Yellow Pages industry stakeholder, for your immediate and unconditional support on a matter of great urgency.

As you know, San Francisco Board of Supervisors President David Chiu has launched an all-out attack on the Yellow Pages industry with his proposed OPT-IN ordinance, which would require publishers to obtain prior permission to deliver in San Francisco.

The ordinance is a job-killer, discriminates against our industry, and is a direct violation of the industry's First Amendment rights.

Supervisor Chiu has ignored the comments of consumer advocacy groups, the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW), local advertisers who depend on the Yellow Pages to make their phones ring and doors open, and publishers and vendors who employ thousands of Californians and pay millions of dollars in state and local taxes.

Please seize on this opportunity to ask the San Francisco Board of Supervisors to VOTE NO ON President Chiu's proposed ordinance.
